Update from members

SDU

Management decided a year ago that all VIPs should have an ORCID. The academic councils approved this decision. SDU library will suggest that ORCID becomes part of the Open Science policy at the upcoming revision. Some Faculties have more ORCIDs than others. Tek is ahead. Ph.D's are required to get an ORCID and does so.

SDU has some GDPR concerns that we would like to discuss later.

AU

Haven't done too much since the initial implementation a few years ago. Arts wanted another round of implementation – which AU are doing. Arts management encourages researchers to get an ORCID.

3.000 ORCIDs in Pure at the moment.

DTU:

No policy demanding an ORCID for researchers. 4.500 out of 5.500 ORCID's registered about (1300) 35 % synchronize publications to ORCID from Pure. Recently made a coordinated effort to get more researchers to synchronize, with very low success.

DTU have an increase in new ORCID's in January due to some institutes using ORCID for their research evaluation.

ORCID's are stored in HR-system – and gets automatically synchronized into Pure.

KU:

4 to 5 years ago management decided that researchers should have an ORCID. Was changed so Faculties could decide themselves. KU have more than 5.300 ORCID's. 4.800 in Pure. More than 60 % are synchronizing from Pure to ORCID. Making an ORCID is voluntary.

Have not implemented import from ORCID. Sees the issue of publications imported from ORCID getting internal affiliation as a big problem.

KADK

Only push ORCID when helping with other related Pure questions. Of 286 researchers 69 have an ORCID, 49 have approved synchronization. Getting close to 30 % of their people having an ORCID. It's not mandatory for researchers.

Researchers have no benefits of getting an ORCID ID.

Don't have import from ORCID to Pure.

Trying to sell ORCID as the place to register old publications and Pure as the place for their new publications.

Don't recommend researchers to connect ORCID to other research profiles (Scopus, WOS)

CBS:

There hasn't been much implementation effort the last couple of years. Have been told by management not to prioritize ORCID. The contact librarians encourage new employees to create an ORCID. Have a short LibGuide. 580 ORCID's in Pure of 1.500 researchers. Librarians have been putting the IDs into Pure for the researchers since they don't have access themselves. There is talk of opening up Pure for the researchers.

RUC:

Approx. 500 VIPs of which 266 have an ORCID in Pure. 190 synchronize from Pure to ORCID. Mostly social science and humanities researchers. There is no official ORCID mandate at RUC at the moment. Working on an open science policy where ORCID might be included. Give researchers ad-hoc support on ORCID.

AAU:

3.741 researchers at AAU. 1.557 with an ORCID (42%). 877 people have authorized synchronization (23%). Uses the Ph.D courses and boost your researcher profile courses to get people to create an ORCID. ORCID was part of a research dissemination performance report. Encourage export from Pure to ORCID but discourage import from ORCID to Pure. Encourage researchers to connect ORCID to other research profiles.

OJS - journals.aau.dk and aauforlag.dk – trying to get these to implement ORCID.

ORCID Roadmap and experiences from other European consortia

ORCID is working on making it possible to register co-authors – the infrastructure is already there, but the functionality is not yet available.

The ORCID interface has been improved to better encourage users to register a personal e-mail address so they will have access to their ORCID account when they change workplace.

Ivo gave [an update on the state of the ORCID board and team](#).

The ORCID corporate website will be refreshed. Working on an ORCID data platform – more metrics and better reporting. Member self-service platform improvements - giving members better functionality to update data ect.

15 member consortia in EMEA

Gabriella gave a short [presentation of five consortia and their development and results](#). Austria, France, Germany, Israel, UK and Ireland (established two days ago).

Several of the European consortia has funders as members.

Discussion around further implementation of ORCID in Denmark

Suggestion: When making a drive to get more researchers to get an ORCID – focus on the tools in ORCID for import of publications from different sources so the task of populating a profile seems less daunting.

Suggestion: Perhaps make a joined/coordinated approach for an ORCID drive during the international Open Access Week. ORCID have outreach material available on their website that we can use – but we would need a bit of funding to print it.

Poul would like to do an awareness push for the Open Access Week if someone else is willing to help.

As answer to SDUs GDPR concern: Will Simpson at ORCID is their GDPR expert – ORCID is GDPR compliant. Both Germany and Ireland have done additional examinations of ORCID's GDPR standards and these have been successful.

Suggestion: Should ORCID be put on the agenda for the Pure user days (Pure Brugerdagene)? It is too late for the upcoming user days, but the idea can be used for next time.

Poul is willing to work to get Funders involved but will also need help with this. Adrian has volunteer to help. Gabriella has a webinar around April or May for funders that we can try and get some Danish funders to attend.

ORCID is hoping to get in contact with the EU. Plan S has a mention of ORCID.
